This year we have several fundraising opportunities to ease the financial burden for camp and mission trips.

#### 1) Chick Fil A Night:

Where: Chick Fil A – Belleview Shores location 5260 S Wadsworth Blvd, Littleton When: Wednesday night, January 29<sup>th</sup> from 4-8pm A portion of the proceeds for all sales at this Chick Fil A will go back to our Student Department for funds specifically used for Scholarships, Fundraising costs, and to sponsor students. Bring everyone you can for dinner and please stop to say hello to our youth kids and leaders. We will be hanging out, playing games, and giving out prizes all night inside the restaurant.

#### 2) Student Summer Fundraiser:

On April 5<sup>th</sup> we will be holding our 4<sup>th</sup> annual Student Summer Fundraiser. Last year we raised over \$4000 for camps and mission trips and are hoping to raise even more this year.

#### **Details and expectations for the Student Summer Fundraiser:**

- **Sign up:** To participate in the auction, you must sign up by **March 25**<sup>th</sup>. To sign up, fill out the form on the last page of this packet and email it to <a href="mailto:bens@waterstonechurch.org">bens@waterstonechurch.org</a>
- **Set up:** If you choose to participate in the auction, you are expected at the church by 8:00am on April 5<sup>th</sup>. We will have tables set up for you to put the items you are auctioning on display. You must be there at 8:00am to go over the information for the morning. Not arriving promptly, may result in the loss of your space for the fundraiser.
- **Completion of Service**: If you and your student choose to auction *service items*, this year we are requiring a hard completion deadline of June 10<sup>th</sup>. If the service you have auctioned off is not completed by June 10<sup>th</sup>, a refund will be given to purchaser of that service. This is to prevent any service items being left undone once a student has gone on the trip.
- It is your responsibility to complete the agreement. We expect all participants of the Student
  Auction to promptly contact the purchaser of their auction items and complete the tasks and
  services that were agreed upon. Failure to do so can result in a forfeiture of opportunity.

#### Here are several options to consider to put up for auction:

- Crafts—Last year, several students put together items such as paintings and homemade
  coasters to be auctioned off. These received great interest from congregants and sold quickly.
  One student fully funded his trip simply from selling coasters. Be creative with this option and
  there could be huge returns.

- **Food**—We also saw several students make cookies and pies that they sold the day of the auction. The nice thing about this option, (and the craft option) is that with a little preparation beforehand, you can be fully funded and done by the date of the auction. It doesn't require any follow up.
- **Gift Baskets**—Parents and students worked with local stores and restaurants to have items donated that were then put in gift baskets and auctioned off. We even have a staff member at the church who is willing to give some pointers on how to make this a successful option for your family.
- Services—There were also students who choose to auction off their various services such as baby sitting, guitar lessons, and yard work. If you and your student choose this option, you are required to complete your services with the purchaser by June 10<sup>th</sup>. If the tasks are not completed by that date, the purchaser will receive a full refund, and you will forfeit the opportunity to earn this money. This is to prevent purchasers from paying for a service and then waiting months for it to be completed. For this option to work, parent involvement is crucial.

#### A few helpful tips as you consider your options for the fundraiser:

- By far our most successful auction items were foods and crafts. Getting creative with these ideas can have great returns.
- Parent involvement was crucial. Students following through on commitments was challenging last year. In order for this to continue to be a success, we need parents cooperation in ensuring students follow through with their commitment.
- Items that could be purchased and received day of the auction did the best at last year's auction (such as homemade coasters).
- Be really creative!

#### 3) Cinco de Mayo Walking Taco Night:

On May 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Student Ministry will create a Walking Taco Bar for attendees of the Saturday and Sunday services. We will have different teams on Saturday and Sunday. There are only **eight (8)** spots on each day, so it is first come, first serve. All proceeds from events will go to the students who work them. On May 2<sup>nd</sup>, students must show up at the church at 3:30pm that afternoon to prep the meal to be sold that evening and will be at the church until cleanup is done around 8pm. On May 3<sup>rd</sup>, students must show up at the church at 8am to heat up the food and will be at the church until after cleanup is done around 1pm. **Sign up by April 26**<sup>th</sup> **at the latest by sending the form below to bens@waterstonechurch.org**
